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The Measure I Citizen Oversight Committee, established May 16, 2017, consists of five members appointed by each of the five City Council Members, to, once established, serve four-year terms. The Committee will meet twice annually, once to be briefed on the annual budget (mid-year) and again to review the Annual Audit Report, specific to Measure I. Members must live in Tulare.

The Citizen Complaint Review Board is charged with the responsibility to review the Police Department's investigation of citizen complaints in specific areas and provide an independent review to the Chief of Police. The Board does not recommend or review disciplinary action against employees. Seven members of the Board are appointed by the City Council to two-year terms. An eighth, non-voting member is selected by the Police Officers Union to sit on the Board. Board meetings are held on the second Tuesday of the month, at 5:30 p.m. at City Hall.

GENERAL INFORMATION

City Council appointees to boards and commissions must reside in the City of Tulare. If you would like to apply for appointment to any of the boards or committees described in this pamphlet, you must complete a candidate application form and return it to the City Clerk's Office. When a vacancy occurs on any of the boards you have indicated an interest in, the City Council will conduct interviews of all candidates on file prior to selecting. Applications are kept on file for a period of two years from the date of receipt or until appointment, whichever occurs first.

Because the Council recognizes that the time of its citizen volunteers is very valuable, a policy has been adopted regarding attendance requirements for all Council appointed members of boards, commissions and committees. Members who are absent from three consecutive regular meetings or 50% or more of all meetings within any consecutive twelve-month period will be automatically removed from the committee upon which they are serving, unless the Council determines there was good cause to excuse those absences. By adopting this policy, the Council hopes to eliminate problems with meetings that cannot be held because of a "lack of a quorum".
