TRAININGS

ACADEMY INSTRUCTOR CERTIFICATION COURSE (AICC)

This course meets the basic instructional skills training requirement to teach in the P.O.S.T. Regular Basic Course and for the Academy Instructor Certificate Program. Students will gain facilitation skills and an understanding of how to employ adult learning methodologies appropriate for various law enforcement topics

ACTIVE SHOOTER RESPONSE

This course is designed to provide instruction to deputies and supervisors on how to safely and effectively respond to an active shooter incident. Students will participate in skills building and scenarios designed to reinforce the techniques presented. An infrared weapon system (IWS) will be used.

ADVANCED OFFICER COURSE

This eight (8) hour course will satisfy first aid/CPR and AED refresher through tested application of proper techniques. It will provide training in tactical combat casualty care during mass casualty incidents and test students' knowledge through application/testing. It will cover legal update.

ADVANCED ROADSIDE IMPAIRED DRIVER ENFORCEMENT

ARIDE was created to address the gap in training between the Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) and the Drug Evaluation and Classification (DEC) Program. ARIDE accomplishes this by providing officers with general knowledge related to drug impairment and by promoting the use of DREs in states that have the DEC Program. The ARIDE program also stresses the importance of securing the most appropriate biological sample in order to identify substances likely causing impairment.

ARSTCTL/FIREARM/DRVTNG/TACCOM

This course is designed to meet the POST perishable skills requirements for: Driver Awareness, Firearms, Tactical Communications, and Arrest & Control.

Perishable Skills: Tactical firearms, driver training/awareness, arrest and control, communications-tactical.

BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION

This course is designed for law enforcement or civilian personnel who are responsible for conducting Background Investigations for hiring of public safety personnel. Topics include background process, psychological evaluations, interviewing techniques and documentation. This course is Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) and California Standards and Training for Corrections (STC) approved. Pass/No Pass only.

BATON INSTRUCTORS COURSE

This course is designed to teach law enforcement students to become a Baton and Impact Weapons instructor. The course includes straight baton, side-handle baton, expandable straight baton and riot baton. The course thoroughly covers principles and concepts of baton tactics, use of force in relation to baton tactics, de-escalation of force, baton coaching, as well as principles and concepts of course development, planning, instructional techniques and methods, record keeping, testing and lesson plan development. The 32-hour Modified Baton Instructors Course will be offered periodically and is designed for students who recently and successfully completed our 80-hour Defensive Tactics Instructor course.

BLOODSTAIN PATTERN ANALYSIS

This Introductory one-week (40-hour) course is designed to acquaint the student with the concepts of bloodstain pattern analysis and interpretation including its history and legal issues. The students will learn about various methods of measurement and mathematics associated with documentation. Commonly used description terms will be taught to the students and there will be practical exercises and demonstrations of bloodstain patterns, weapon and blood correlations, and how different building and clothing materials affect bloodstain patterns.

CANINE PROGRAM MANAGEMENT

The goal of the Canine Program management course should be for the student, no matter the level of experience handling a police canine, to be able to effectively develop and manage a law enforcement canine program from the ground up. The student should leave the class with the knowledge and understanding of conducting needs assessments, selection of canines, selection of handlers, training issues, record keeping, use of force issues and civil liability.

CELLUAR PHONE FORENSICS/INVESTIGATION

This 40 hour course is designed to provide law enforcement personnel with foundational skills and knowledge necessary for the forensic examination of cellular phones. Special circumstances arise and special consideration has to be given when a cellular phone is used as an instrument of crime or when a cellular phone contains records of criminal activity. These records can be in many forms including, but not limited to; phonebook entries, call history, text messages, calendar entries, images and videos. This course will help the investigator by giving them a foundation for cellular phone forensics so that they better understand and respond to these types of criminal activity.

CHEMICAL AGENT INSTRUCTOR

Designed to prepare experienced peace officers / authorized trainers to teach basic and in-service Chemical Agents classes to peace officers as required by section 22820PC. The course emphasizes issues related to an overview of OC, CS and smoke, delivery methods, decontamination, disposal of aerosol devices, first aid protocols, gas mask application, maintenance of aerosol devices, adult learning concepts, legal issues, performance evaluation techniques, safety protocols, written / oral / demonstration assessment. This is NOT an advanced tactical / SWAT type course. Students should bring an agency fit-tested gas mask (loaner masks available), clothing suited for exposure, tablet or similar device to read memory device. All students will have opportunity for exposure to live CS/OC agents. MATERIALS FEE: \$214.00 NON-POST REIMBURSABLE.

CHILD ABUSE (ICI)

This is a Foundation Specialty Course of Robert Presley Institute of Criminal Investigations (ICI). The course is designed to increase the investigator's knowledge of child abuse and teach proper investigative techniques. Additionally, the course is

recommended for station detectives and specialized child abuse investigators. At the conclusion of this training course, the investigator will have a broader knowledge of child abuse and be able to employ proper investigative techniques while working as a detective or child abuse investigator. REQUIREMENTS.

CLANDESTINE LAB-SAFETY CERT

STUDENTS WILL DEVELOP THE ABILITY TO ASSESS HAZARDOUS CONDITIONS OF CLAN LABS, USE SAFETY EQUIPMENT, OBTAIN EVIDENCE SAMPLES, AND UNDERSTAND THE CAL-OSHA AND FED-OSHA REGULATIONS THROUGH LECTURE, DEMONSTRATION, CLASS DISCUSSION, LIVE SCENARIO EXERCISE AND PERFORMANCE DRILLS.

COGNITIVE INTERVIEW & STATEMENT ANALYSIS

Cognitive Interviewing includes principles of memory retrieval, memory enhancement techniques, using the CIT in the field, many hands-on workshops and taught in a “train the trainer” format. Statement Analysis covers methods for collecting an uncontaminated statement, using the statement to guide the follow-up interview by locating areas of the where information is missing, areas that lack commitment and things that are sensitive to the subject. A by-product of the analysis is to help focus the investigation and the detection of deception. Many hand-on exercises. Out of class work required. For Sworn and Non Sworn Investigators.

COURT & TEMPORARY HOLDING FACL

This course is a basic overview of Title 15 and how it relates to Adult Type 1 Facilities and Temporary Holding Facilities. Participants will be given instruction on Title 15 regulations and special requirements as they relate to adults and juveniles. Regulations, safety, and liability issues will be covered.

CRIM INV INST CORE COURSE (ICI)

The Robert Presley Institute of Criminal Investigation (ICI) Core Course is the prerequisite for all subsequent ICI Foundation Specialty Courses within this program. The core course is designed to enhance the effectiveness of the individual criminal investigators skills in performing the multi-disciplined, multi-leveled tasks

necessary to successfully conduct comprehensive criminal investigations. Instruction in this course is provided through a coordinated, experience-based adult learning approach which addresses crime scene management, interviewing and interrogation skills, search and seizure issues, search warrant preparation, surveillance techniques, case reporting, informant management, media relations, case reporting and courtroom testimony. Students will engage in practical application exercises throughout this course and be required to satisfactorily complete case work and a search warrant.

CRIME SCENE & FORENSIC PHOTOGRAPHY

This 24 hour course provides training and practical experience pertinent to crime scene and forensic photography of physical evidence including latent prints and evidence preservation. Topics include: photo logs, evidence logs, documentation, sketches, print logs, equipment selection, lighting techniques.

CRISIS INTERVENTION

Provides law enforcement officers with techniques to handle and deescalate a subject in a crisis situation. Officers will be able to identify a subject in crisis and be familiar with mental illness. Officer will also be able to make a determination if a subject meets the criteria for H&S 5150, determine if a subject is a danger to themselves, others, or are gravely disabled.

CRISIS NEGOTIATION

To provide students basic theory and practice to peacefully resolve hostage, barricade and/or suicide situations through use of active listening, assessment, and other appropriate negotiating techniques.

D.R.E. FIELD CERTIFICATION

The purpose of this course is to provide individuals who have completed the Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) classroom course the opportunity to demonstrate their abilities to properly and accurately evaluate subjects under the influence of controlled substances under the supervisor of DRE Instructors. This is required for DRE certification.

DRUG INFLUENCE - 11550 H&S

Designed to train LE Officers to recognize, arrest, and properly testify against persons under the influence of drugs. Instructed in substance ID, physical symptoms, objective signs, chemical testing, legal issues and problem related searches. This course is not an equivalency for D.R.E. program school applicants. The curriculum covered in this course is based on DOJ standards.

DUI-DRIVING UNDER INFLUENCE

This is a SFST & ARIDE Course – Designed to provide state of the art instruction of recognition, testing, apprehension and prosecution of DUI. Includes training in: Nystagmus, sobriety testing, legal issues, DUI defenses, report writing, expert witness qualification, case preparation and officer safety.

ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE

Pursuant to Penal Code Section 629 Et. Seq., the course of instruction adder the legal practical aspects of interception of private wire communications and related investigative techniques. Variable format: 8-16 hours.

EVIDENCE AND PROPERTY FUNCTION MANAGEMENT

This course is designed to educate the law enforcement agency evidence and property manager, technician, and supervisor in best practices for organizing, documenting, securing, storing, and handling of evidence and property. Topics include audits, inventories, and inspections; dispositions and purging; effective management functions, and agency self-evaluations.

FIELD TRAINING OFFICER

This course is designed to train newly appointed Field Training Officers (FTO). The FTOs will receive training on goals, objectives, expectations, functions and roles of the FTO. They will also receive training on leadership, ethics, teaching and training skills development, competency in writing evaluations, intervention, remediation, test and scenario development, legal and liability issues, and case studies.

FIELD TRAINING OFFICER UPDATE

Course meets POST requirements for the update training of current Field Training Officers.

FINANCIAL CRIMES INVESTIGATIONS (ICI)

This ICI foundation specialty course provides investigators with the skills and knowledge needed to investigate cases of fraud, forgery, and other financial crimes. Fraud and forgery are a constantly changing, pervasive and multi-faceted area of criminal behavior that demands new and evolving investigative procedures. Students will practice handwriting identification skills, and be provided with instruction in the identification and preservation of evidence involved in computer and credit card crimes, and classification of fraud schemes and organized crime groups. At the conclusion of this course the student/investigator will be able to: interpret and apply laws related to financial crimes; properly identify the elements and processes used in the commission of personal identity fraud; and successfully prepare for and assist in the prosecution of a fraud/forgery related case.

FINGERPRINT, BASIC

Covers development of the Henry Classification Formula; Pattern Recognition; Ridge Counting; Whorls of Clarification of Fingerprints.

FIREARMS INSTRUCTOR

This course is specifically designed to prepare experienced law enforcement personnel to teach basic firearms courses at the basic and in-service level. Topics include the role of the law enforcement firearms instructor, liability issues, instructor development, lesson plan development, basic marksmanship, shooter problem analysis, standard and non-traditional shooting positions, weapons transition, and tactical movement and cover.

FIREARMS/TACTICAL RIFLE

Designed for Field Officers who are authorized to carry a tactical rifle. Emphasis placed on AR15/M16/M4 rifles. Successful completion of this course satisfies the legislative training mandate to possess short barrel rifles as specified in PC 33220(b) and the Commission training requirement to possess long barrel rifles as specified in Commission Regulation 1081.

GANG INVESTIGATION, ADV. (ICI)

This is a foundation specialty course of Robert Presley institute of Criminal Investigations (II). Course is designed to develop the skills of the gang investigator to the higher level. The course addresses the intricacies of gang investigations at the advanced level to include; wiretaps, gang “buy/walk” investigations, managing confidential information and informants, prosecution strategies and expert testimony.

HOMICIDE INVESTIGATION (ICI)

This Robert Presley ICI foundation specialty course provides investigators with the information and skills to aid them in a proficient homicide investigation. This course is designed for detectives who investigate homicides and is modeled in adult based learning. Each block of instruction will include hands on activities which require active participation from the class, or small group collaboration. Students/investigators in this class are required to investigate a fictitious homicide which will involve them in collecting/packaging evidence at the crime scene, following up on information provided to them, preparing a search warrant(s) and presenting their case to a panel of legal experts. Students are also required to attend a site visit / tour of a crime lab and coroner's office; and participate in an outdoor crime scene practical in which they learn methods for determining a potential burial site, how to excavate a body and how to collect insect evidence.

HOSTAGE NEGOTIATIONS

Course provides the basic knowledge and skills for entry level law enforcement crisis negotiators. Covers philosophy and techniques of crisis negotiations, team concept of crisis negotiation with role and responsibilities of team members. Types of incidents, subjects, concept and methods of threat assessment throughout the situation.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING INVESTIGATIONS (ICI)

This new Robert Presley ICI foundation specialty course provides investigators with hands-on training in the multi- faceted area of Human Trafficking and related undercover operations. Topics covered include Human Trafficking victimology, victim-centered approaches to investigations, laws and legal applications, potential ethical issues, evidence collection, and proactive case development to include technology used to commit Human Trafficking crimes (internet) as well as

technology available to solve crimes. At the conclusion of this course, the student/ investigator will be able to: interpret and apply laws related to Human Trafficking crimes; demonstrate competency in investigating crimes related to Human Trafficking; identify, access, and preserve crime-related physical and electronic evidence; properly and legally conduct undercover operations; and successfully prepare for and assist in the prosecution of Human Trafficking cases.

IDENTITY THEFT INVEST (ICI)

This is a foundation specialty course of Robert Presley Institute of Criminal Investigations (ICI). Designed to provide seasoned investigators assigned to identity theft cases to receive state of the art training in the investigation and prosecution of identity theft cases. Adult instructional methodology will be employed along with hands on training with internet site.

INTERNAL AFFAIRS INVESTIGATION

Provides attendee with a comprehensive analysis of the issues, legal considerations and procedures concerning internal investigations. Focuses on the investigative aspects of internal discipline.

INTERVIEW & INTERROGATION

Designed to improve an investigators ability to gather testimonial evidence from victims, witnesses and suspects in a legal, ethical and effective manner. Topics covered include interview psychology, interview protocol including cognitive interview technique, dimensional analysis of behavior, credibility assessment interviewing, the BATI 6 phases of interrogation, false confessions, eyewitness identifications and legal concepts all taught using hands-on experiential learning methods. This course is an ICI Universal Elective and is certified POST Class for Patrol, Sworn and NON Sworn Investigators.

LEGAL UPDATE

This course will provide information concerning current legislative changes, new or modified laws, case decisions and judicial decisions which affect a peace officer's working environment. Legal Update is offered as a block of instruction within a 24-hour Perishable Skills Program and cannot be taken as a stand-alone class.

MANAGEMENT COURSE-MODULE A

This 104 hour course meets the POST training requirement for lieutenants/managers. It is delivered in three modules: A, B, and C. There are 13 primary topics that will be addressed in this course that meet the POST management objectives. Each module must be completed in the appropriate sequence.

MANAGEMENT COURSE-MODULE B

This is the second part of a three part series. Each Module must be completed in the appropriate sequence.

MANAGEMENT COURSE-MODULE C

This is the third part of a three part series. Each Module must be completed in the appropriate sequence.

MEDIA RELATIONS

Course is designed to provide officers with tools to serve as the Public Information Officer for an agency, how to plan press conferences, how to give on camera or radio interviews, how to write effective press releases, how to promote the agency and find the right message in the media and understand the rules and laws related to media relations and release of information.

MOTORCYCLE TRAINING

Provides basic skills for motorcycle traffic patrol duties. Teaches proper riding techniques allowing for the safe operation of a police motorcycle. Course includes: riding skills, survival techniques, accident cause and prevention, motorcycle familiarization.

MOTORCYCLE TRAINING INSTRUCTOR

The course is designed to train experienced motorcycle officers to serve as instructors in teaching safe patrol motorcycle skills. This course allows the student to teach all facets of motorcycle operations relating to cone patterns, evasive maneuvers, braking control, and solo and pairs riding. Students will also learn

adult learning theories and training techniques. Students must demonstrate an ability to teach motorcycle riding skills. Pre-requisite: Must successfully have completed POST Basic Motorcycle Training.

NARC INVESTIGATION (ICI)

The Robert Presley Investigation (ICI) Major Drug Investigation Course is one of 14 ICI Foundation Specialty Courses within the Robert Presley Institute of Criminal Investigation. This course is designed for peace officers who are currently assigned or will be assigned to investigate major drug investigations. The course covers drug in field training, undercover surveillance, and counter surveillance. Provides qualifications to identify, arrest, and successfully prosecute various major drug violations. This course is designed to enhance the effectiveness of the individual criminal investigators skills in performing the multi-disciplined, multi-levelled tasks necessary to successfully conduct comprehensive major drug investigations. Instruction in this course is provided through a coordinated, experience-based adult learning approach.

NARCOTIC UNIT SUPERVISION

Designed for supervisors of Narcotics Units and includes ethics, civil liability, information control, case management, search warrants, undercover operations, critical incidents, task force issues, stress intelligence and several workshops.

OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTINGS, INV (ICI)

Designed for experienced detectives, this scenario based training course will focus on critical incidents, including: officer involved shootings; use of force incidents; and in custody deaths. Participants will be assigned to an investigative team, respond to a different use of force incident scene, and conduct an investigation into the scenario incident. Investigation techniques will include crime scene management and documentation, conducting interviews, and evidence collection. A participant presentation to a panel of experts will culminate this training. Topics covered throughout this course include understanding stakeholders, lawful and unlawful force, physiological and psychological changes (human factors), administrative and criminal investigations, legal considerations and courtroom testimony, crime scene reconstruction, video forensics, taser incidents, excited delirium related deaths and contemporary critical incident case studies.

PHOTOGRAPHY, FORENSIC

Lessons in the history and use of imagery, photography and its application to the law, basic concepts of creating a photograph, light and the camera, differences in using film and digital photography and how they relate, light spectrum, file formats and storage, film grain and digital noise, exposure (ISO, shutter speed aperture, depth of field, metering, filters, etc.), and overall photography of basic crime scenes and physical evidence.

PITCHESS MOTION UPDATE

Procedural and substantive handling of a Pitchess Motion. Discussion of recent cases, practical exercises.

PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICER

This course is designed to teach officers the roles and goals of the public information officer, setting the stage for an effective new conference, building relationships with the media, avoiding confrontation with the media, pitching stories and covering breaking news.

PUBLIC RECORDS ACT

Course is designed for personnel who deal with Public Records Act (PRA) requests. Learn the statutory and case law requirements in the dissemination of public records to protect your agency, including current requirements, release exemptions, fees, retention, 1043 motions and record subpoenas.

RADAR OPERATOR

Students will identify the purpose of radar within law enforcement, as related to its history, application, laws, and principles of speed enforcement. Additionally, students will develop the skills, knowledge and abilities necessary to conduct visual estimations of vehicle speed accurately, and assemble, test, and operate a radar unit in support of visual speed estimations. Course complies with all content requirements per California Vehicle Code Section 40802.

RADAR-LASER OPERATOR (LIDAR)

Students will identify the purpose of lidar within law enforcement, as related to its history, application, laws, and principles of speed enforcement. Additionally, students will reassess previously learned skills in conducting and demonstrating their abilities to visually estimate vehicle speed accurately, and assemble, test, and operate a lidar unit in support of visual speed estimations. Course complies with all content requirements per California Vehicle Code Section 40802.

ROLE OF THE POLICE CHIEF

This course is designed to acquaint participants with key issues facing law enforcement professional who is a newly appointed chief, interested in becoming a police chief or a second in command that wants to find out how to best support your chief.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

School Resource Officer is a 40-hour course designed for the officer assigned or newly assigned as a school resource officer. Topics include: school law, mentoring, basic teaching skills, instructional techniques and constructing a course outline.

SEARCH AND SEIZURE

The student will develop an understanding of general search and seizure requirements as well as obtain the ability to author a sound search warrant. Emphasis is placed on general criminal investigations including vehicle searches, narcotics seizures and warrantless searches as well as authoring search warrants specific to body intrusions, digital devices (cell phones/computers/social media) and special circumstances. The course will allow patrol Officers and Investigators to write search warrants based upon scenarios and participate in practical exercises inclusive of all phases of the search warrant process.

SEARCH WARRANT

This is a comprehensive search warrant course designed for patrol officers and new investigators. Topics include the contents of a search warrant, what can be searched for and where, special circumstances surrounding certain search warrants, and essential elements of a well written search warrant to best gain judicial approval and reduce personal and agency liability.

SEXUAL ASSAULT INVESTIGATION (ICI)

This is a foundation specialty course of Robert Presley Institute of Criminal Investigations (ICI). The course is designed to increase the investigator's knowledge of sexual assault and improve investigative techniques. The course teaches the reporting process for prosecution by means of experience-based learning. The course is recommended for station detectives and specialized sexual assault investigators. At the conclusion of this training course, the investigator will: Be knowledgeable in the field of sexual assault investigations, be able to employ proper investigative techniques, prepare reports for filing, prepare a case for prosecution.

SHERMAN BLOCK SLI SESSION 1

Purpose of institute is to enhance the leadership abilities of first-line supervisors in California law enforcement. Institute consists of eight 24-hour sessions (192) hours presented over eight months. Each class of students progresses together from session to session.

SHERMAN BLOCK SLI SESSION 2

Purpose of institute is to enhance the leadership abilities of first-line supervisors in California law enforcement. Institute consists of eight 24-hour sessions (192) hours presented over eight months. Each class of students progresses together from session to session.

SHERMAN BLOCK SLI SESSION 3

SHERMAN BLOCK SLI SESSION 5

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SHERMAN BLOCK SLI SESSION 6A (MOT ONLY)

Using the unique environment of the Museum of Tolerance, the goal of the Tools for Tolerance for SLI course is to enhance relevant themes presented in previous SLI sessions by discussing the nexus between diversity and leadership in a historical and contemporary context. These themes include: scapegoating, proactive vs. reactive mindsets, valuing others, groupthink, self-rationalization, and responsibility and accountability. We will also introduce new themes such as advocating dissent and the nature of fear that will be explored further in future sessions.

SHERMAN BLOCK SLI SESSION 6B

This 8-hour course is part of the 24-hour Session 6 of the SBSLI Program (8-Sessions @ 24 hrs each for total of 192 hrs). Session 6 has been updated and divided into 2 components a 6A & 6B. The 1st component, 6A (16hrs), was redesigned by SLI & MOT staff for the SLI program. 6A is being co-presented by SLI & MOT staff at the Museum of Tolerance and 6B (8hrs) will be hosted by SBSLI staff only at the hotel site. 6B will continue the leadership theme and enhance the 6A component.

SHERMAN BLOCK SLI SESSION 7

Purpose of institute is to enhance the leadership abilities of first-line supervisors in California law enforcement. Institute consists of eight 24-hour sessions (192) hours presented over eight months. Each class of students progresses together from session to session.

SHERMAN BLOCK SLI SESSION 8

Purpose of institute is to enhance the leadership abilities of first-line supervisors in California law enforcement. Institute consists of eight 24-hour sessions (192) hours presented over eight months. Each class of students progresses together from session to session.

SUCCEEDING AS A POLICE CHIEF: BEYOND THE BASICS

This course is designed to educate attendees on specific and current issues facing a law enforcement professional who is either a new chief of police or is interested in becoming a chief of police. This course is a build on to the Becoming a Police Chief course. It is not required to take the Becoming a Police Chief course to attend this course.

SUPERVISORY COURSE

This course examines the legal, moral, and ethical responsibilities and challenges associated with first line supervision in the law enforcement environment. Instruction, facilitation discussion, and student presentations revolve around the examination of case studies, reviews and updates of case and statutory law, situational leadership, mentoring, counseling, and problem-solving. In-class activities include examining personality profiles for effective team development and supervision, the impact of technology on field operations, community expectations, developing and conducting subordinate counseling sessions, and preparing performance evaluations and improvement programs.

TEAM BUILDING WORKSHOP

The POST-Certified Team building Workshop (TBW) program provides specialized consultant services to assist the management team of a local agency with problem solving, development of organizational goals and objectives and team building.

TLO BASIC - JRIC

This course is for personnel working within the operational area of the joint regional intelligence center. The course is designed to educate the basic entry level Terrorism Liaison Officer (TLO) with the policies and procedures of the fusion center which they will be working within their area of responsibility. The course will instruct the student: A: How the fusion center receives and distributes intelligence; B: The TLO's responsibilities and fusion center expectations; C: The lawful procedures in how intelligence is collected, used and stored; D: Intelligence procedures on the international, federal and local arenas; E: Region specific international terrorism trends and indicators; F: Region specific domestic terrorism trends and indicators.

TRAFFIC COLLISION INV

Provides peace officers with instruction in basic collision investigation procedures and fulfills the training requirements of 40600 V.C., covers report requirements, cause determination and evidence collection.

TRAFFIC COLLISION INV. INTER

This course introduces the basics of tire mark identification and analysis. Course content includes identification of the various types of tire marks, documentation and measurements, terms and definitions relating to tire mark investigations, case preparation and courtroom testimony, determination of coefficient of friction and drag factor, and speed estimates using various equations.

TRAFFIC COLLISION INV. ADV

Course is designed to prepare students for the complexities of advanced collision investigation methodologies and build on concepts taught in the Intermediate Traffic Collision Investigation class. Course will cover advanced mathematics, vehicle dynamics, scale diagramming, and photography.

TRAINING ADMINISTRATOR COURSE

This course provides students with the ability to understand and complete the POST course certification process through the POST EDI system. Students will also understand modification and maintenance process of courses after they are certified. This course provides an overview of the POST compliance audit process. The 8-Hour Format is designed for specific Regions to be facilitated by the respective Area Representative.

TRAINING MANAGERS COURSE

The Training Managers course is designed to provide law enforcement training managers with the knowledge, theories, skills, and insights essential to successfully carrying out the management of training within modern law enforcement organizations. The course will address the following: The Training Manager's role, developing and implementing a training plan, POST – the organization and its service delivery system, POST compliance, legal issues associated with training,

determining individual and organizational training needs, and training records management.

VEHICLE THEFT INVESTIGATION (ICI)

This course is directed at the training needs of investigators assigned to investigate vehicle thefts. The Robert Presley Institute of Criminal Investigation Vehicle Theft Investigation Foundation Specialty course provides the necessary information for vehicle theft investigators to perform their job and presents the duties and responsibilities frequently faced during vehicle investigations.
