  - If you wish to address Commission, please verbally notify the Secretary of the Commission.
  - Persons wishing to address Commission concerning an **agendized** item will be invited to address the Commission during the time that Commission is considering that particular agenda item. Persons wishing to address Commission concerning a **non-agendized** issue will be invited to address Commission during the Public Comments portion of the meeting.
  - When invited by the Commission Chair to speak, please stand, state your name and city of residence, and make your comments. Comments are limited to three minutes per speaker.

#### **Americans with Disabilities Act**

Comments related to General Business items will be heard at the time those items are discussed. In fairness to all who wish to speak, each speaker will be allowed three minutes with a maximum time of 15 minutes per item unless otherwise extended by Commissioner. Please begin your comments by stating your name and providing your city of residence.
4. **COMMUNICATIONS** - Communications are to be submitted 10 days prior to a Commission Meeting to be considered for this section of the agenda. No action will be taken on matters listed under communications; however, the Commission may direct staff to schedule issues raised during communications for a future agenda. Public comments will be limited to three minutes per topic unless otherwise extended by the Commission.
